



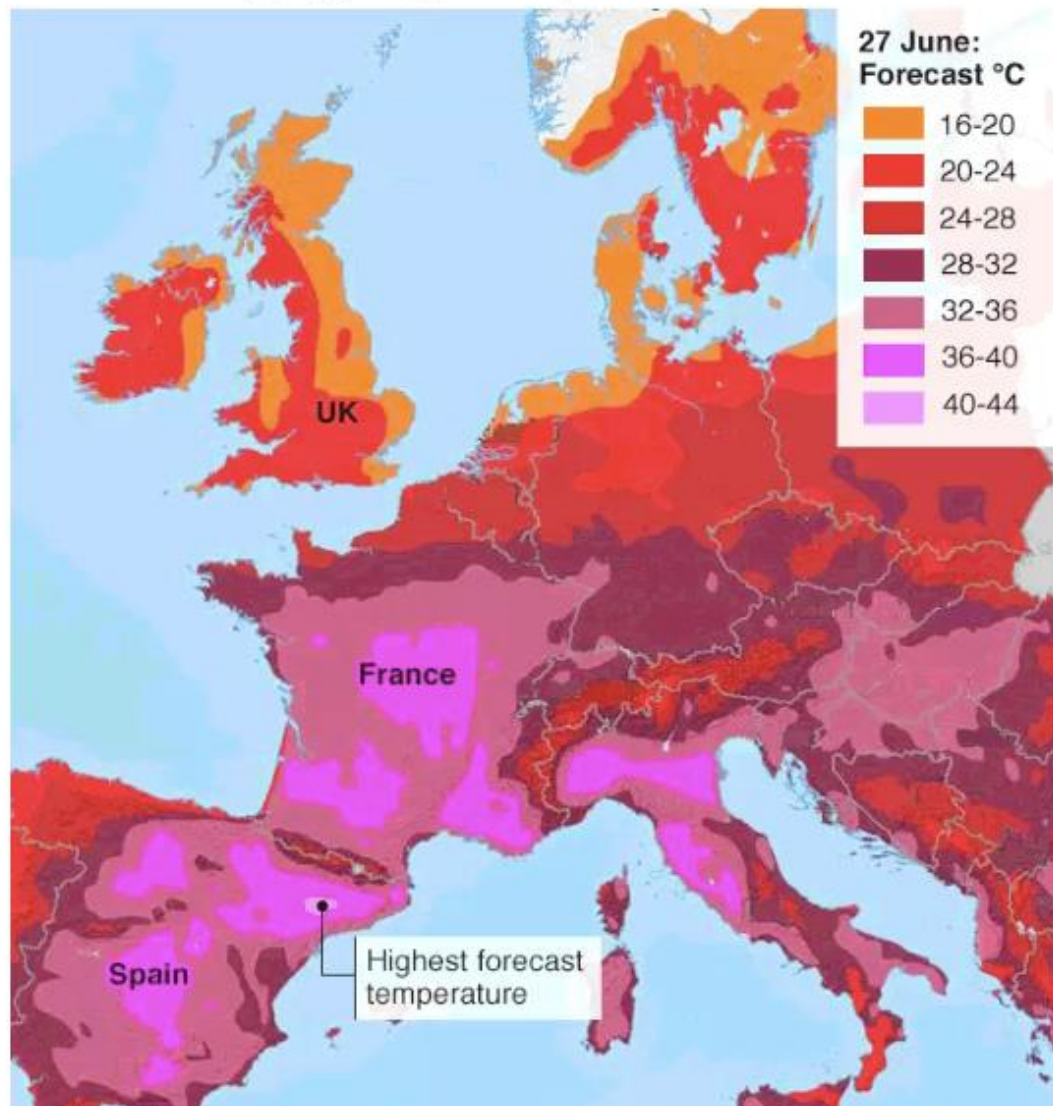

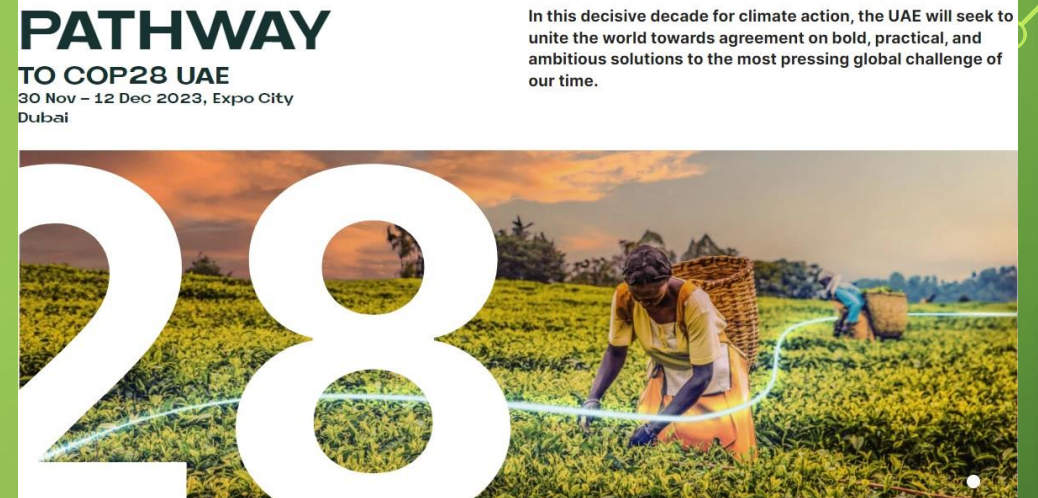

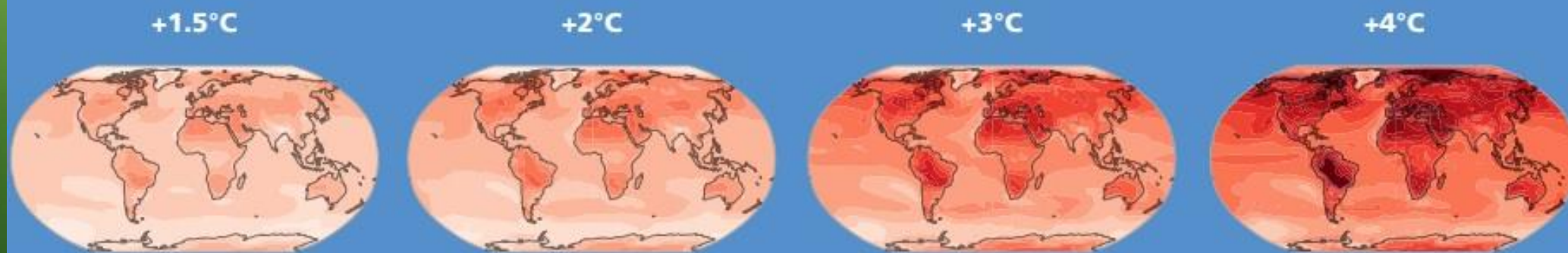

Over the past several years of the international climate change negotiations it has been established and agreed by governments across the world, who are Parties to the UNFCCC, that gender equality and ensuring women's human rights are necessary to effectively act on climate change mitigation and adaptation. - **Disproportionally impacted** – structural inequalities and lower socio-economic power: energy poverty, food & water insecurity, more dependent on public services
- **Care more** – when empowered can be huge catalysts of behavioural change and can embrace green employment opportunities
- **Less represented at decision making table** – Enhanced Lima Work Programme on Gender

57. *Encourages* Parties to increase the full, meaningful and equal participation of women in climate action and to ensure gender-responsive implementation and means of implementation, including by fully implementing the Lima work programme on gender and its gender action plan, to raise climate ambition and achieve climate goals;

58. *Invites* Parties to provide support to developing countries for undertaking gender-related action and implementing the gender action plan;
